• Lessons Learned

The workshop will be a classroom setting typically addressing special incidents that have happened over the past year in Minnesota and the lessons learned from these events from the responders of these incidents.

• Professional Development: The 9L's

Battalion Chief Corley Moore, Moore Fire Department (OK) & Firehouse Vigilance & The Weekly Scrap, Firefighter Podcast



The mission of the class is to give people the tools they need to build a high performance culture within their organization. I am extremely

passionate about this, and I believe that understanding these principles can challenge anyone, anywhere to improve the culture of their department. The presentation is broken down into nine principles of leadership all of which start with the letter "L". Learn, Listen, Love, Look, Laugh, Level, Live, Labor, Last. The ultimate point of the class is to provide them with the single greatest tool that I can give to someone in a leadership role, and that is a lens by which you can judge every decision around the firehouse... before you make it. (I say firehouse on purpose... not fireground)

Safety: Beneath the Badge -Don't Wait Until You Break Dave & Christi Dvke. Beneath the Badge

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After an unexpected detour caused him to retire early, Dave & his wife, Christi, began sharing their story of what often lies silently beneath the badge, and have quickly become highly

sought-after keynote speakers. Together, they walk you through their experiences on how PTSD ended Dave's career, led to suicidal thoughts and the planning of the same, & the near demise of their marriage. They intimately understand the mental health struggle that many are facing, often in silence.

Their story is emotional, uncensored, and raw. Mixed with humor, and at times a few tears, their vulnerability breaks the stigma with a powerful message resonating to all in attendance, no matter the background instilling a feeling of hope and resilience all the while emphasizing finding balance in one's own life and the importance of self-care.

• Hot Topics: Mitigating the Impact: Building Resources from Within the Firehouse

Chief David Brosnahan, Roseville Fire Department & Jonathan Bundt, MA, LMFT, MNCEM

This program works to better address firefighter mental health by providing the insight, tools, and resources of having an embedded mental health professional in your fire department. Most of the existing response and support programs for firefighters are reactive. In this presentation, we will look at the balance of preparing your firefighters not only in reacting to stressful events but also in creating proactive approaches to improving well-being and mental health. By utilizing models and actionable items that provide immediate access to a licensed professional, ongoing training, and organizational support the instructors will demonstrate the steps involved in establishing an embedded mental health program.

This program will review existing post-traumatic stress, chronic stress, substance abuse, suicide threats, and relationship challenges firefighters are facing. And how to better address mental health in your organization to reduce your firefighters' chances of being victim to it.

Through step-by-step guidance, case studies, audience participation, and deliverables, fire officers will leave this class with a better idea and understanding of how to establish their own embedded mental health program within their fire department.

Ashes, a K9 service dog, will also be available to meet and ask her handler questions about this valuable program.

• MnFIRE: LivingWorks safeTALK Pro Network

The statistics are well-known: Police, paramedics and firefighters are at a higher risk of dying by suicide than the average citizen. LivingWorks suicide prevention training adds a layer of support, within workplace and social networks, which can help first responders with practice and appropriate action plans to help keep their peers and the community safer from suicide. LivingWorks safeTALK is a four-hour training that equips firefighters to be more alert to someone thinking of suicide and better able to connect them with further help.

• **Professional Development: Reflexive Readiness** – Battalion Chief Corley Moore, Moore Fire Department (OK) & Firehouse Vigilance & The Weekly Scrap, Firefighter Podcast

In the fire service we never know what call will be the call of our lifetime. There is no guarantee that the next fire we run on will be a run-of-the-mill one. Reflexive Readiness is all about learning the core concepts that will allow a person to build a culture of Unconscious competence. So that when things are hard and changing and chaos is trying to rear its head, we can be ready, adaptable, confident and competent. No short class can turn someone into the ultimate fireground expert, but Reflexive Readiness provides the tools and a framework for beginning that journey. Starting on the premise that making decisions is simple when you understand your priorities, and then building from there. Just remember that simple does not mean easy! The remainder of the class is then spent defining fireground tactical decision making, and how to best maximize each and every attendee fireground experience, training, situational awareness and their comfort level when making decisions. I believe there is a massive need in the fire service to prepare those in decision making roles to be more decisive and deliberate on the modern fireground. To understand that decision making is based on understanding your priorities. When there is a clear understanding of this throughout an organization then you can operate at a very high level, and with intentionality. Experience, combined with training to maximize your situational awareness and enhance your comfort level. The keys to achieving this are outlined in this class. When things are hard and changing, nothing can replace a well prepared and decisive fireground commander.
